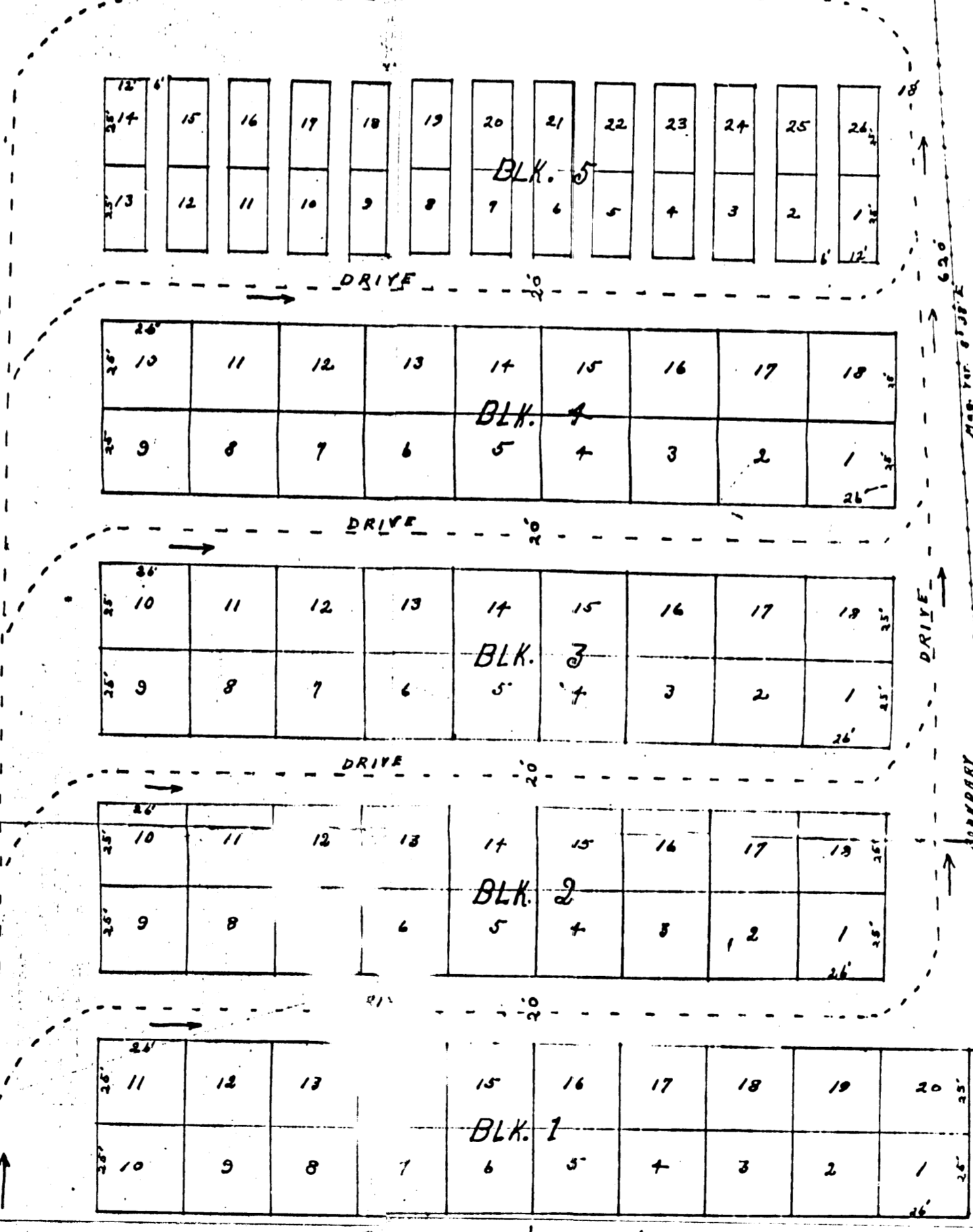

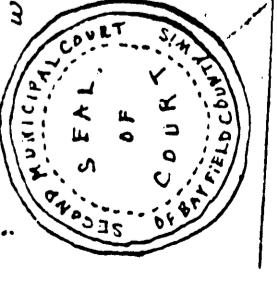

July 14, 1924

I, Harry C. Hall, being duly sworn, do hereby certify that in June, 1924, at the request of the Town Board of the Town of Barnes, Wis. a survey and plat of the Town cemetery was made. That the boundaries were run and fenced some three or four years ago. That apparently the courses were run with a pocket compass, and the distances passed as all sides differ in length and course. That the cemetery contains Eight and ninety-two (892) graves fenced in North of the road in the S.E. corner of the S.E. 1/4 of the N.E. 1/4 - Sec. 29 - T. 45 N. - R. 9 West, Bayfield Co. Wis. That the above plat represents accurately all distances, courses and angles taken in the field. That two hundred and five (205) pieces of iron pipe were used as monuments to boundary, block, and lot corners.
