

Where Do I Enter My Items?

1. To enter something in the Fair, you must first decide if your items belong in Open Class or Junior Class.
 - A. If you belong to a Bayfield County youth club such as 4-H, FFA, Scouts, or any other club with Adult Supervision, and are in grades 3-13, THEN you enter in JUNIOR Classes.
 - B. If you are a youth who does **not** belong to any organized club, THEN you enter in OPEN Class.
 - C. If you are an Adult, THEN you enter in OPEN Class.
2. Next, you must figure out which Department your item or items fit into. All Junior Class Departments start with the number 100 (101, 102, etc). Open Class Departments do Not start with the number 100 (2, 3, etc). The animal categories are pretty self-explanatory, others you may have to look a little bit through this premium list to figure it out.
3. THEN you need to figure out which CLASS your item will fit in. Many times the Class is based on your experience level (Professional, Amateur, etc) or breed (animals), grade (Junior Class) or type of item type (grain, cut flowers, bread, etc.)
4. THEN the LOT number.

For Example; If you are an ADULT with hand knitted slippers you would like to enter in the Fair. You would enter the pair in DEPARTMENT 27 (Open Class Knitting & Crocheting), CLASS A (Hand knitting), LOT 1(Slippers)

If you were a 4-H YOUTH, in Grade 6, you would enter them in DEPARTMENT 127 (Junior Class Knitting & Crocheting), CLASS A (Grades 3-8), LOT 2 (Slippers).
5. **You may ONLY enter ONE item in each LOT number.**
6. Fill out an entry form and return it with your exhibitor fee to the Fair Office by the due dates of July 19 (Open) or 26th (Jr.). If entry forms are received after these dates the \$25 entry fee applies.
 - A. The entry fee is the same regardless of how many different items you enter.
7. The dollar amounts listed throughout the premium list is the amount that you could win (premiums), depending on the placing your item receives.
 - A. Items Judged in Open Class DO NOT Always Place or Earn a Premium
8. Remember you are just registering the items you would like to bring to the Fair. The actual Items will need to be brought to the Fair Grounds on Thursday, August 26th between Noon and 7 pm.

Open Class entry Forms & Fees must be received at the Fair Office By Monday, July 19, 2010

All Wisconsin residents are invited to enter Open Class.

Entries in the Junior Class are limited to members (grades K-13) of a recognized youth organization in Bayfield County under adult leadership and with an educational program, including 4-H, Boy Scouts, and Girl Scouts.

All entries must be brought to the Fair Grounds on Thursday, August 26th, between the hours of Noon and 7 pm. and may only be picked up after 5:30 pm on Sunday.

ENTRY TAGS



Entry Tags will be printed two weeks before the Fair.

Junior Class entry tags will be picked by Club designee for the entire club at the Fair Office. They will not be mailed.

Open Class entry tags may be picked up the Fair Office in Washburn. If you are unable to pick them up, please indicate if you would like to have them mailed or taken to the Exhibit Hall on Thursday of the Fair. (your admission ticket will be in with your entry tags.)

The Fair Office is located in the Bayfield County Courthouse in Washburn, The Fair office is located on the 21st floor in the Tourism Department and is open between the hours of 8 am and 4 pm.

Entry items must be brought to the Fair on Thursday between the hours of Noon and 7 pm. with entry tags attached.

If you decide not to bring an item,

PLEASE turn in the entry tag to the Superintendent and indicate that it is a “No Show.”

Exhibit Hall Booths

Booth space in the Harry Lowe Exhibit Hall MUST be obtained directly from the Fair Secretary.

You must make reservations in advance by filling out an entry form.

Booths will be numbered and exhibitors can receive a diagram and assignment in advance. There is no entry fee for exhibiting a display booth, but you do not receive a season pass. When an item is placed into a booth, it may NOT be removed during the fair.

If you have entered a booth for your organization, and you wish to enter items for yourself, you must fill out another entry form and pay the appropriate fee.

One booth reservation per club/organization. - If there are any booths available after this, you may reserve an additional booth.

Sales from booths are not allowed.
Educational information may be left for the public to pick up.

Booths must be put up on Thursday from Noon - 7 pm.
Booths and items in the booths may not be removed until 5:30 pm on Sunday.
All items must be removed by 7 pm on Sunday.

An admission ticket is required on Sunday, even if you are only picking up an exhibit.

The Bayfield County Fair and Fair Committee are not responsible for animals or exhibits that have not been picked up by 7:00 p.m. on Sunday.

EXHIBIT RELEASE TIMES

The Harry Lowe Exhibit Hall will be closed to the public from 5:00 – 5:30 p.m. on Sunday to prepare exhibits for release.

It will re-open at 5:30 p.m. to release the exhibits .

All Exhibits must be picked up by 7:00 p.m.

All animal exhibitors must leave displays up
and animals in the barns until 5:00 p.m. on Sunday.

The Bayfield County Fair and Fair Committee are not responsible for animals nor exhibits that have not been picked up by 7:00 p.m.

Bayfield County Fair Committee Requirements

In addition to requirements of law, this fair Committee has adopted certain precautionary measures designed to meet the unusual animal health problems which arise whenever large number of animals from different sources are assembled for exhibition. All exhibitors must comply with the provisions set forth below:

1. Feeding and watering of all livestock and cleanliness of exhibit area is the responsibility of the exhibitor. Premiums may be withheld if stalls are not kept cleaned.
2. Exhibitors must provide and use only their own utensils and water buckets in caring for their livestock.
3. Animals must be transported in clean and/or disinfected cars and trucks to and from the fair.
4. All horses entering fairgrounds must provide proof of a negative Coggin's test taken during the current calendar year. A copy is acceptable. Proof must be submitted with the entry form.
5. All dogs must be vaccinated for rabies and DHL and Parvo Virus within one year of show date. Certificates must accompany fair entry form. A copy is acceptable. Only dogs being shown as an exhibit &/or service dogs are allowed on the Fair Grounds during the Fair.
6. All sheep and goats must have a Scrapies ID tag.
7. All Poultry must come from a certified Pullorum Free flock or a Wisconsin Tested Flock or Associate Flock or be certified as Pullorum Free.
8. All Dairy, Beef, Sheep, Meat Goat and Swine exhibitors must include with their entry sheet an Exhibitor Entry Statement with appropriate signature(s) confirming that they have read and understand the National Code of Show Ring Ethics as printed in this premium list and will comply with it.
9. Cattle exhibitors are responsible for furnishing animal identification to fair officials for fair records. The Cattle Identification Form, which appears at the end of this premium list, must be completed and returned with entry sheet. Identification numbers will be checked by barn superintendent upon arrival at the fairgrounds.
All calves over 2 months of age must be identified by an official ear tag, breed registration tattoo or breed Registration number. For steers, either an official ear tag or the metal ear tag applied at weigh-in may be used.
10. All cattle exhibited must be dehorned or polled, unless horns are a significant feature of the breed.
11. Consumption of Food and Drink in the barns is HIGHLY discouraged.

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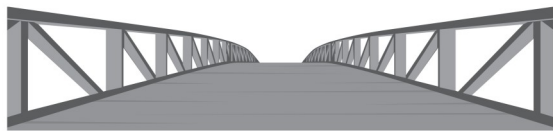
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
