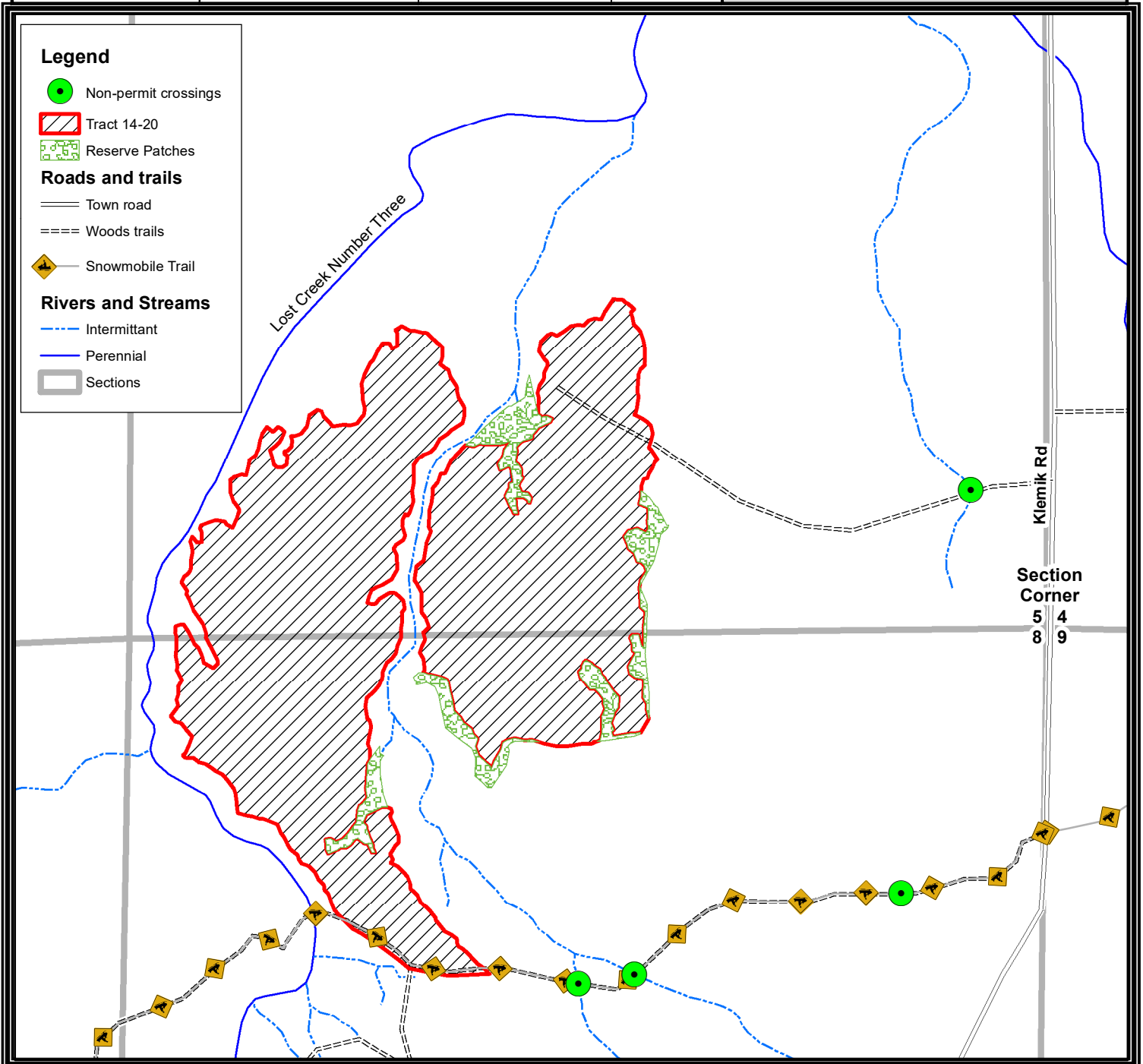

TRACT 14-20 – HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

A. PRESCRIPTION:

1. Aspen coppice harvest. Residual 1 sq.ft./acre to 10 sq.ft./acre of white cedar, red pine, red oak, white pine, and elm.

B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

1. Cut all trees greater than 2" diameter, EXCEPT:
 - i. DO NOT HARVEST OR DAMAGE white cedar, white pine, red pine, or red oak.
 - ii. DO NOT HARVEST OR DAMAGE red oak saplings.

C. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS and SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS:

1. Harvest only during frozen conditions, as determined by Bayfield County.
2. This sale has several areas of concentrated flow to cross that will not require permits and may require crane mats. Bayfield County may have crane mats available for contractors use. If County mats are used, Contractor will be required to move the mats to the job site and then return the mats to a location designated by Bayfield County.
3. Sale boundaries are red paint lines as indicated on map.
4. If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.

D. ACCESS AND ROADS:

1. This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
2. Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.
3. During winter harvesting the snowmobile trail must be kept unobstructed and in a packed snow condition. The purchaser must ensure that harvesting and hauling operations will not create a safety hazard to snowmobiles.
4. The primary haul route utilizes a portion of the snowmobile trail. Excessive damage (beyond normal wear and tear) to the trail, as determined by the county, will not be tolerated. If Bayfield County determines excessive damage has occurred, the Contractor may be held responsible for a portion or all of the repair. The County and Contractor must communicate on a regular basis to ensure issues are addressed in a timely manner and the snowmobile trail remains in a safe and acceptable condition

E. OTHER:

1. To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
2. Do not damage survey monumentation.
