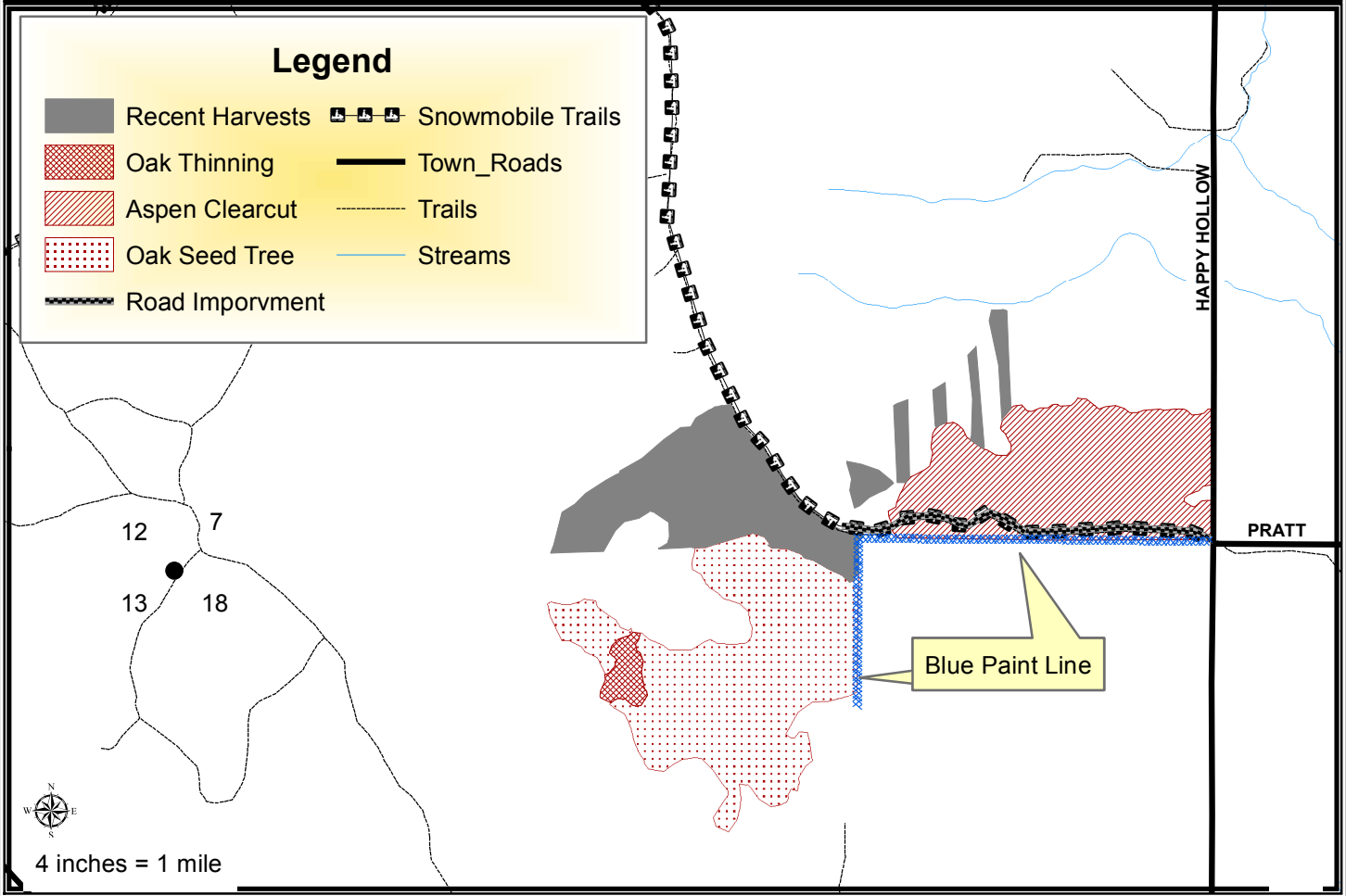

Harvest Requirements:

- Sale is being sold on a Ticket Scale Basis
- Sale boundaries consist of red paint line, blue paint line, recent harvest, or Happy Hollow Rd.
- The blue paint line indicates private property. No equipment or felled trees may cross the line.
- Oak Thinning: Harvest all orange marked trees and all aspen and birch 2" and greater. **No sale operations allowed between breakup and July 1st.**
- Aspen Clearcut: Leave all conifer and purple marked trees. Harvest all unmarked hardwoods stems 2" and greater. **In this unit only, sale operations may only occur when the ground is frozen unless written permission is granted by Bayfield County.**
- Oak Seed Tree: Leave all purple marked trees and all conifer except harvest all balsam fir 4" and greater. Harvest all unmarked hardwood stems 2" and greater.
- Do not cut snags except for those that pose a safety hazard.
- **Approximately ½ mile of existing road will need improvement (See attached Happy Hollow Road Project Map for specifications) contractor will be responsible for these improvements.**
- During winter harvesting the snowmobile trail must be kept unobstructed and in a packed snow condition. The purchaser must ensure that harvesting and hauling operations will not create a safety hazard to snowmobiles.
- To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
- Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.
- If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
- This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
