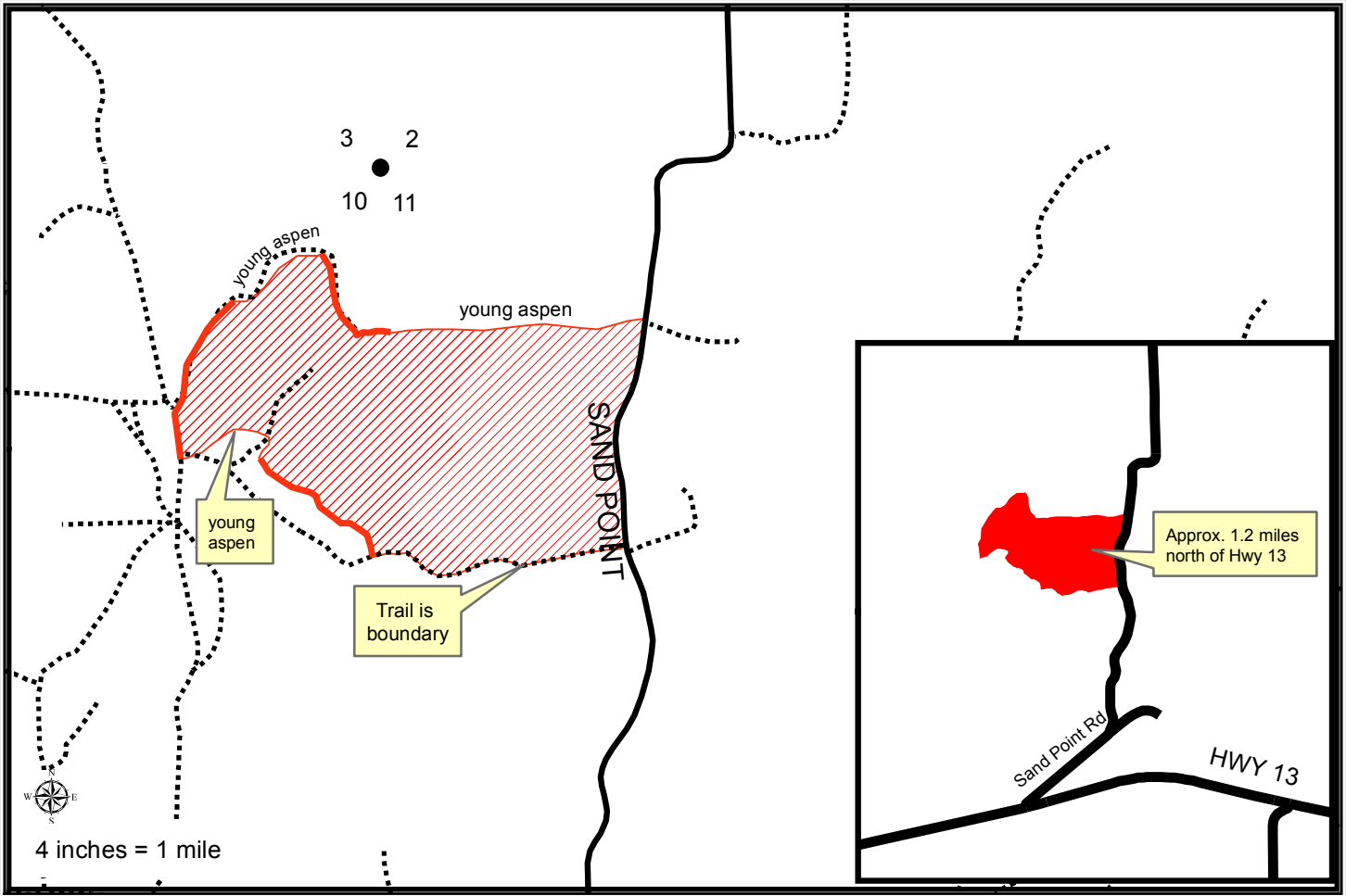

Harvest Requirements:

- Sale is an aspen coppice being sold on a Ticket Scale Basis.
- Harvest all merchantable aspen and hardwood. Harvest all orange-marked white pine, orange-marked red pine, unmarked merchantable white spruce and merchantable balsam fir. Do not harvest any orange-marked white spruce, orange-marked white birch, unmarked white pine, unmarked red pine, cedar, hemlock, yellow birch and submerchantable conifer.
- Sale boundaries are abrupt changes in timber type (young aspen), existing trails and painted red line.
- This sale includes scattered trees that are painted with an orange "X". Operator must fell and leave all trees marked with an orange "X". "X" marked trees should be cut 5 feet above ground level and should lie as close to the high stump as possible. These trees will create ruffed grouse drumming habitat.
- Do not cut snags except for those that pose a safety hazard.
- Sale operations may only occur when the ground is frozen unless written permission is granted by Bayfield County.
- To comply with the Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off of the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
- Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.
- This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
