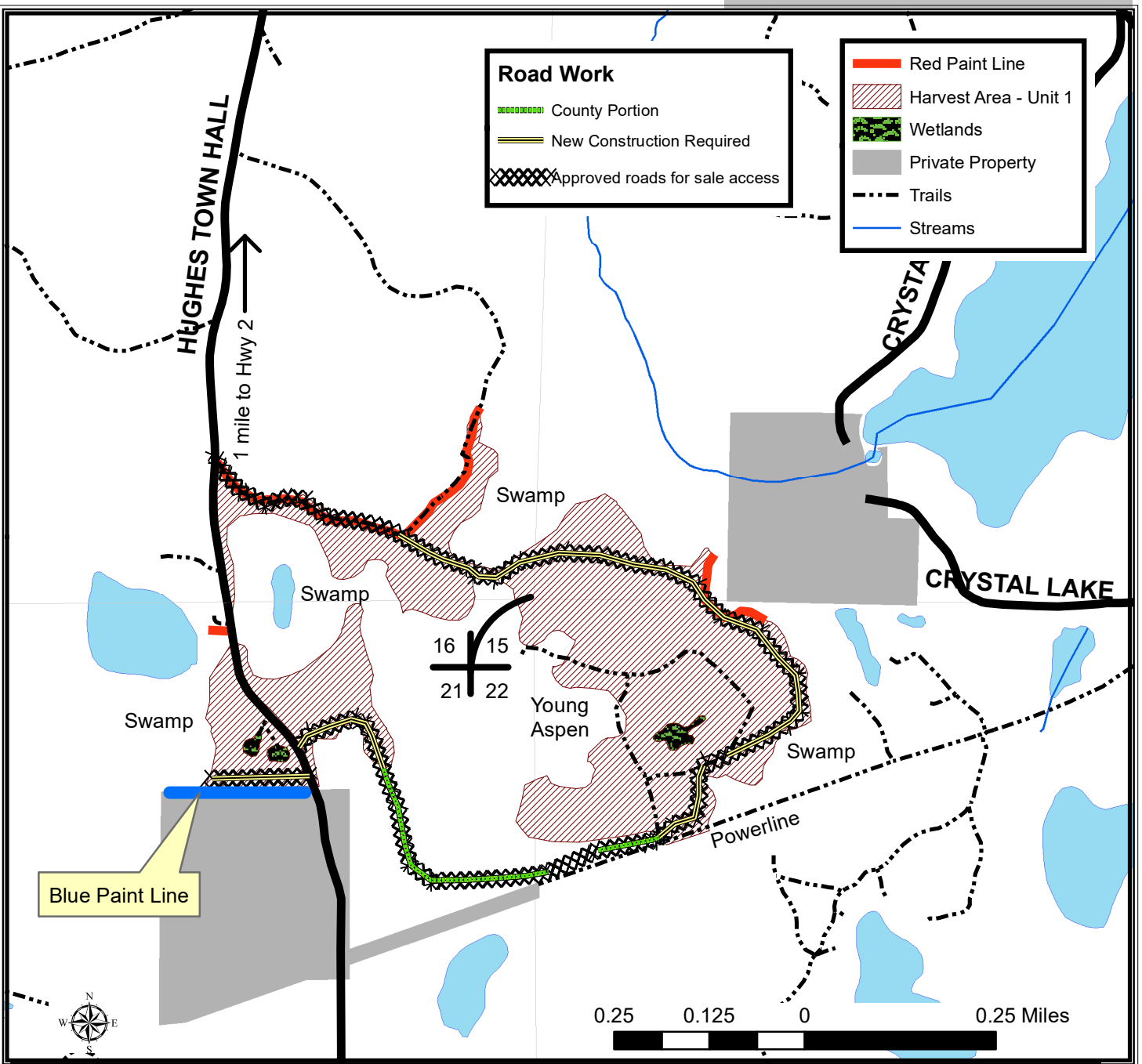

TRACT 09-21 – HARVEST REQUIREMENTS

The following terms and conditions supplement those provided in the Bayfield County Timber Sale Contract.

A. PRESCRIPTION:

- Harvest unit 1 has a clearcut prescription with an estimated average residual basal area of 0 ft².

B. HARVEST REQUIREMENTS:

- In unit 1, harvest all stems 2" and greater.
- Cut all snags.

C. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS AND SEASONAL RESTRICTIONS:

- The blue paint line indicates private property. No equipment or felled trees may cross the line.
- Sale boundaries consist of red paint line, blue paint line, trails/roads, young aspen, or swamp.
- From May 19th to October 16th care should be taken to avoid open sandy areas with equipment and felled trees due to the possible presence of a rare animal.
- No equipment allowed within 15 feet of wetlands indicated on map or any swamps adjacent to the sale area. Contractor may reach in to harvest the trees within the 15 foot buffer. No tops/logging debris allowed in wetlands.
- Harvested pine cannot be kept of the Bayfield County Forest for more than three weeks from May 1st to August 31st.
- If harvest will utilize the whole tree, 1 in 10 tops must be left scattered throughout the sale.
- Do not damage any survey monumentation.

D. ACCESS AND ROADS:

- Contractor may only access sale on roads indicated on the map as "Approved roads for sale access".
- Some portions of the access roads may require new construction, which are indicated on the map. However, contractor is not required to build or use all the new construction indicated on the map. The contractor is required to use or build only the length of road necessary to satisfactorily harvest the sale area.
- The section of road indicated as County portion on the map will be made driveable by pickup truck no later than August 1st, 2021.
- This contract requires County authorization for all road/landing construction and places a number of other requirements on road construction and closure.
- Decking of wood along town roads will not be allowed without permission from Bayfield County.

E. OTHER:

- To comply with Best Management Practices for Invasive Species: Prior to moving equipment onto or off the sale area, scrape or brush soil and debris from exterior surfaces to the extent practical.
- Utilization specification is to a 4" top. However, if the County determines that pulpwood markets continue to be very poor at the time of harvest the County will sign a contract amendment with the purchaser changing the utilization specification to a 5" top for selected species. When determining condition of the market, the County will pay particular attention to the amount of wood being purchased by the mills in Wisconsin Rapids and any other significant shifts in wood demand.
