Water Analysis

Beach monitoring is done through the Memorial-Labor Day season. According to Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) criteria, a beach **advisory**** is issued at 235 MPN and **closed*** at 1,000 MPN and above. Water sampling is done either once or twice per week depending on the beaches location and popularity.

All beaches are closed under the following conditions:

- Whenever a human health hazard exists as determined by the local health department.
- After a major pollution event where potential exists that indicator levels may be expected to exceed a standard.
- After a significant rainfall event that is deter-
